





# **Comic Relief Local Communities Grant Guidelines**

There are still many communities in the UK that suffer from economic and social deprivation and the current economic climate may make this situation worse. This programme aims to empower local people empower local people enabling them to create lasting change in their communities. Projects should be run by people directly affected by the issues they are dealing with and priority will be given to small, locally based groups or organisations in areas of disadvantage that have a clear understanding of the needs of their community. This can also include 'Communities of Interest' which cover a wider geographical area.

Under the programme, organisations can apply for funding to:

- Increase local services,
- Build skills of local people,
- Increase community cohesion,
- Respond to local economic needs.

While groups will be using a range of activities we specifically want 50% of the available funds to go to sports projects that:

- increase access to sport and exercise for people who face social exclusion and isolation
- Help people who are experiencing difficulties in their lives.

# Who can apply?

Organisations which have received a Community Cash grant or any other grant from a Community Foundation <u>can</u> apply for a Local Communities grant. However organisations which hold a grant directly from Comic Relief, <u>can not</u> apply for Local Communities Grant. Groups may have a variety of structures however must be able to evidence a clear set of rules, a committee or board and have a community bank account with at least 2 unrelated signatories as authorisation.

The following types of charitable organisations may apply:

- Community Groups
- Residents Associations
- Community Centres
- Social Enterprises
  - a. Community Interest Companies (CIC) \*
  - b. Community Interest Organisations (CIO) \*
- Credit Unions

<sup>\*</sup> Community Interest Companies/Community Interest Organisations must have a minimum of 3 directors at least two of which are unrelated.

### Types of activities that might be funded

- Community sport activities
- Furniture projects
- Projects providing access to benefits advice
- Projects combating fuel poverty
- Community consultation exercises
- Community employment projects
- Food co-ops
- Running costs; including salaries, core costs and project costs
- Committee and volunteer/staff training

#### **Exclusions**

Grants will not be awarded to:

- Individuals;
- To statutory organisations, including schools;
- To fund trips abroad;
- To fund buses, mini buses or other community transport schemes (not including transport costs forming part of a project);
- To fund building costs, including access adaptations to buildings;
- To organisations who are in receipt of a grant directly from Comic Relief.

## How much can I apply for?

The Local Communities Programme will run for two years and during this time, grants of between £1,000 and £10,000 will be available. A local Communities grant  $\underline{MUST}$  be at LEAST 30% of the total project costs.

## When can you apply?

We are open for applications at certain times throughout the year, a timetable of our opening and closing dates is given below.

(for the first round only, we aim to spend at least 50% of the money available, on projects which 'increase access to sport and exercise for people who face social exclusion or isolation).
