Role Title: Volunteer Youth Support Worker

About The Junction:

We're a vibrant charity, empowering children, young people, and their families in Tees Valley. We believe in building trust, self-belief, and a sense of belonging through positive relationships and meaningful participation. We're proud of our reputation for championing children and young people's voices and driving positive change through social action.

Hours: Variable Hours – Twilight, Evening, Weekend and School holiday provision available

Role Purpose:

- To support service delivery through structured group work sessions to enable access to services and other opportunities.
- To support positive outcomes for children and young people.

Support and key contacts:

Each volunteer will be assigned a mentor and receive further support from Service and Project Coordinators.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

- Supporting the delivery of Group Work Activities
- Developing activities that further children and young people's personal and social development
- Contributing to session planning and evaluations and communicating the needs of young people.

Working in Teams

- To work as part of a motivated team of staff to provide group activities to service users.
- Undertake other duties and responsibilities commensurate to the role as identified by the volunteer and mentor through the Volunteer Development Plan.

Placement options will be discussed with you in terms of timings and locations available for volunteering opportunities upon application. We will try our best to accommodate your needs in relation to any reasonable adjustments you may need to make volunteering possible.



What The Junction offers volunteers:

- A clear induction process and training programme that aims to equip you with the skills, confidence and knowledge to succeed in your voluntary role and the area you volunteer in.
- Clear boundaries around your role and not replacing paid staff members within your role, ensuring you receive the support that you need and are not given responsibilities of an employed position
- Consultation and involvement within Junction activities and about your role at least annually
- Clearly defined support and supervision to enable you to develop within your role.
- The reimbursement of reasonable costs associated with your voluntary role.
- A safe working environment including insurance coverage for your work at The Junction Foundation.
